Registration for the event opens Saturday November 12th, at 10:00 a.m., and will run until Sunday November 20th, where it will close at 11:59 p.m. All of the rules and guidelines for Cupcake Day on Locke Street can

be found in the contest section of Sweetness Bakery's website.

Deighton earned his Honours Bachelor of Arts in history from the
University of Western Ontario and King's University College, between
the years of 1986-1993. Deighton's past work experiences include

between April 1998-June 2003.² In March 2010, Deighton developed Sweetness Bakery, which opened its first location in August 2010.³ Along with Sweetness Bakery, Deighton is also the president and owner of Go Bee Industries Inc/Go Bee USA Inc since June 2003.⁴ Go Bee Industries is an experiential marketing company with field marketing personnel across North America.⁵ The company specializes in mobile tour production and experiences, sampling, promotions, product launches, consumer intercept and event management.⁶ Steve Deighton's strong background in business has helped make Sweetness Bakery a successful business.

Susan Rucchin, Manager/Business Development



Susan Rucchin is the manager and business developer for Sweetness Bakery. Rucchin earned her Honours Bachelor of Business Administration from Wilfred Laurier University between the years of 1988-1992.⁷ Rucchin previous work experience includes the position of Account Manager for Storck (Werther's Original), where she focused on sales and marketing.⁸ Susan's current role at Sweetness Bakery is very

similar to that of a general manager, as she oversees all aspects of the business, which includes human resource, operations, sales, and marketing. Susan Rucchin's business background as well as previous managerial roles makes her well qualified for the position of Manager/Business Development at Sweetness Bakery.

- The location that receives the most business is the Ancaster location.
- With the purchase of 6 or more items, there is no tax.
- Has a seasonal/holiday menu in addition to its regular menu.
- Approximately 20 different varieties of cupcakes are made each day (at each location).
- Home of the "Sweety Pop" (otherwise known as cake pops). Available in 4 different flavours.
- 35 different cupcake flavours available.
- 14 different cake flavours available.
- 9 different pie and tart flavours available.
- 7 different square flavours available.
- 7 different cookie flavours available.

BACKGROUNDER

Sweetness Bakery opened to provide readily available, nut-free choices to consumers who are interested in freshly baked cupcakes, cakes and a number of other delicious treats. When Steve Deighton, owner of Sweetness Bakery, found out that his two-year-old son Foster was allergic to both peanuts and tree nuts, Deighton and his wife decided to open a bakery. Their mission was to open a bakery that would be safe for anyone diagnosed with anaphylaxis (peanut/nut allergy) to visit and purchase items without thinking twice about what they are buying. Opening a bakery on the foundation of this credential is exactly what Deighton and his wife accomplished.

Steve Deighton and his wife find their greatest joy in life from their kids. ¹¹ With Sweetness Bakery, Deighton and his wife wanted to capture their children's sweet spirit to "embrace and marvel at new things, be young and live life to its fullest forever". ¹² As a result, Deighton named the bakery "Sweetness" after his Daughter, Chloe, who shares this as her nickname. ¹³ Deighton also created a line of treats known as "Foster's Favourites", which are Foster's recommendations to patrons of Sweetness Bakery. ¹⁴

The first Sweetness Bakery location opened Saturday August 28th, 2010 in Burlington, Ontario. Since then, one location in Ancaster, and two locations in Hamilton have also opened in late November 2011, Sweetness Bakery will open their fifth location in Dundas. Steve Deighton continues to expand the business to various locations in and around the Hamilton area because of the exclusive market.

Other than cupcakes, Sweetness Bakery also offers pies, tarts, squares, cookies, cheesecake and their famous "Sweety Pops", otherwise known as cake pops. ¹⁹ All of the products sold are peanut/nut-free and are prepared by accredited pastry chefs and bakers. ²⁰ Sweetness Bakery also sells gluten-free and sugar-free treats, as well as accepts special orders for these products. Recently, Sweetness Bakery introduced a mobile truck unit, which allows the bakery's sweet treats to be sold at local festivals and community events. ²¹

Sweetness Bakery also plays a charitable role within community. In the past, the bakery has partnered with a number of different charities, including: United Way, Easter Seals Disability Services, Shoppers Drug Mart Weekend to End Women's Cancers, and Juravinski

Cancer Centre Foundation.²² Sweetness Bakery has also donated funding to the Joseph Brant Memorial Hospital and the Burlington Art Centre's Children Programming.²³

Sweetness Bakery will host an upcoming event, "Cupcake Day on Locke Street" on November 26th, 2011 at the Locke Street location (196 Locke Street South, Hamilton, Ontario), from 12:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. This event is inviting local bakers, friends, families, and community members to come to the location and enjoy the afternoon by participating in the competition, or partaking in the complimentary activities. Canadian celebrity chef Anna Olson, as well as Sweetness Bakery's owner, Steve Deighton, will be judging the competition.
